Job changes

Mark Anderson, owner of the BuzzFactory advertising and marketing agency in Palm Springs, has been elected as a governing board member for **Cielo Vista Charter School** in Palm Springs. Anderson fills the seat vacated by Teri Simon when she moved out of the area.

PHILANTHROPY

The H.N. and Frances C. Berger Foundation, in partnership with CBS Local 2, presented a \$25,000 Coachella Valley Spotlight grant to the **College of the Desert Foundation** in September. The funds will benefit the McCarthy Family Child Development and Training Center, which is the model lab/demonstration program for the Early Childhood Education department and offers free and low-cost child care.

Edison International has presented a \$5,000 award as part of Edison's community outreach Healthy Kids, Healthy Families Program to **Food Now** in Desert Hot Springs. The money will be used to help fund Food Now's food distribution program.

Desert Healthcare District recently approved more than \$500,000 in grants to local organizations.

» The LGBT Community Center has received a \$69,138 grant to conduct a needs assessment to identify and measure unmet health needs among LGBT residents in the region.
