



About 29% of firearm-related deaths in San Diego County were homicide.



And about **71%** of firearm-related deaths were **suicide**.

About 3 in 10 of all firearm-related deaths (2017-2022) were veterans.



Among these veteran deaths, most (93%) were suicides.

Recommendations

Recommendations are organized into strategic areas of focus and emphasize actions that can be undertaken, funded, or coordinated by the County.

These recommendations are an array of responses, as there is no one policy or practice that will "solve" the issue of gun violence. Rather, a coordinated, well resourced, and multifaceted public health approach is needed.





AWARENESS & ADVOCACY

Support community outreach to share information and resources for suicide, domestic violence, and community violence prevention. Support distribution of free gun locks. Provide gun safety training to County staff. Promote standard use of suicide screening tool in

healthcare settings.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & COLLABORATION

Facilitate a Gun Violence Reduction Community Advisory Group to guide prevention efforts. Facilitate collaboration across agencies, organizations, and sectors.



COMMUNITY HEALING & TRAUMA-INFORMED PRACTICE Engage with stakeholders in southeastern and northern San Diego County to establish

and northern San Diego County to establish new and expand existing programs for underserved youth. Establish a partnership with trauma hospitals to connect firearminjury patients and their families to support services.

PLANNING & EVALUATION

Have a central office or unit in the County government to lead gun violence reduction efforts. Monitor and evaluate program effectiveness. Share data with the public and hold town halls/listening sessions. Develop a strategy to secure funding for violence prevention efforts.
